A. Qualifications and Experience:	- Be registered, or be eligible for registration, as a Speech and Language Therapist by the Speech and Language Therapists Registration Board at CORU. AND - Have the requisite knowledge and ability (including a high standard of suitability and professional ability) for the proper discharge of the duties of the office. AND - Provide proof of Statutory Registration on the Speech and Language Therapist Register maintained by the Speech and Language Therapists Registration Board at CORU before a contract of employment can be issued. <u>Annual registration</u> - On appointment, practitioners must maintain annual registration on the Speech and Language Therapists Register maintained by the Speech and Language Therapists Registration Board at CORU. AND - Practitioners must confirm annual registration with CORU to Enable Ireland. - Eligible to work in the State.	- Post graduate work experience as a Speech & Language Therapist. - Experience of interdisciplinary team working. - Experience working with children with disabilities and their families. - Any relevant post graduate training specific to child disability services. e.g. Hanen, Lamh, PECS, ADOS, AT training. - Experience in working with Assistive Technology. - Post graduate experience in Feeding, Eating, Drinking and Swallowing (FEDS).
