Education and Qualifications	<i>Essential or willingness to complete:</i> • 1. 5M1761 – Intellectual Disability Practice • Specifically focused on supporting individuals with intellectual disabilities. • Includes modules like Intellectual Disability Studies, Care Support, and Person-Centred Focus to Disability. • 2. 5M4339 – Healthcare Support • Prepares learners to work in a variety of healthcare settings. • Often required for Health Care Assistant roles in hospitals and residential care. • 3. 5M3782 – Health Service Skills • Designed for those working or intending to work in the healthcare sector. • Includes modules such as Care Skills, Care Support, and Safety and Health at Work. • 4. 5M4349 – Nursing Studies • Ideal for learners planning to pursue nursing at higher education. • Covers Anatomy and Physiology, Human Growth and Development, and Nursing Theory and Practice. • 5. 5M2786 – Community Care • Focuses on providing care in community settings. • Includes modules like Social Studies, Care Provision and Practice, and Work Experience. • 6. 5M4468 – Community Health Services • Prepares learners for roles in community health and social care. • Emphasizes health promotion, community development, and support services.
